

# Allow execution on Mac OSX > 10.15

Apple has a security system to prevent the installation of malicious software called Gatekeeper. This function could be disabled through **System Preferences > Security & Privacy** and activate the option **“Allow apps downloaded from”** and then indicate **“any site”**.

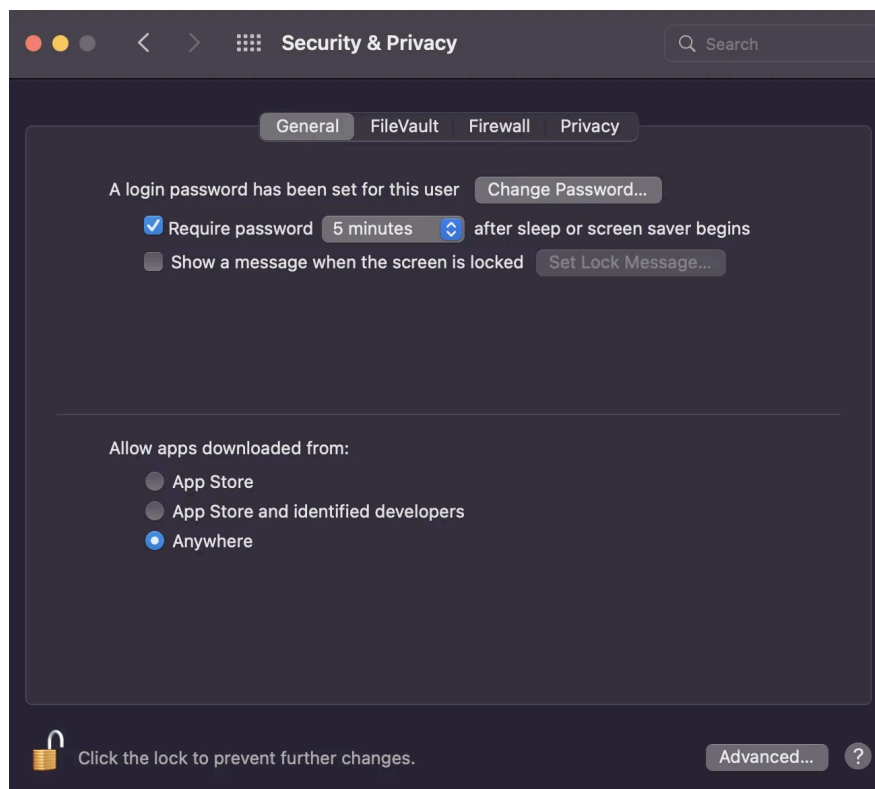
However, starting with versions 10.15 the **“anywhere”** option is usually hidden.

If after downloading ImageQA or RoughProfiler you receive the alert **“app is damaged and can't be opened. You should move it to the trash”**, it is not that the file is damaged but that it has been blocked by Gatekeeper.



This happens because my tools are not signed, which implies the payment of an annual fee as an Apple affiliated developer.

If you want to use my tools you must activate **“anywhere”** but the problem is that this option **appears hidden** in some versions of OsX



## Solution:

Open your terminal and type:

```
sudo spctl --master-disable
```

Next, it will ask you for your login password. When you enter the password, the text will be hidden.

Finally, press enter and your preferences will be set to “**anywhere**”. The next time you run ImageQA or RoughProfiler, it will open without any problems.
